

Saint Thomas Academy's Schurhamer Commits To University of Maine

MENDOTA HEIGHTS, Minn., Nov. 28, 2011 – Saint Thomas Academy announced today that E. Schurhamer '12 of St. Paul has verbally committed to playing Division 1 hockey for the University of Maine Black Bears. The defenseman was named captain of the Academy's hockey team this season after recording 9 goals and 23 assists in 31 games in the 2010-11 season, as the Cadets won the 2011 Class 1A state championship. It was the Academy's third state championship since 2006.

Schurhamer will play a year of junior hockey before joining Maine with a full scholarship for the 2013-14 season. The Black Bears play in the Hockey East Association and won national championships in 1993 and 1999.
