Saint Thomas Academy traditionally has a waiting list for all grade levels. It is recommended that the admissions process be started as early as possible. All incoming students, grades 7 through 10, are required to take Saint Thomas Academy's entrance exam.

## ADMISSIONS APPLICATION TIMELINE

### October–November

- Complete and submit an application for admission, including the student essay and teacher recommendations.
- Attend the Fall Open House on Sunday, November 2, 2008, at 1:00 p.m.
- Call the Admissions Office to schedule a visit.

### December

- Send the "Transcript Release Form" to your son's current school.
- Register for Saint Thomas Academy's required entrance exam – an application on file reserves his spot.

### January

- Attend the Winter Open House on Sunday, January 11, 2009, at 1:00 p.m. (If you did not attend the Fall Open House).
- Register and take Saint Thomas Academy's required entrance exam on Saturday, January 17, 2009 (9th and 10th grades), or Saturday, January 24, 2009 (7th and 8th grades).

### February–March

- Apply for financial aid, if desired.
- Academy acceptance letters are mailed.
- Return the enrollment contract with a \$400 non-refundable deposit by March 2 to confirm acceptance (the deposit is applied toward tuition).

## 2008 - 2009 Financial Aid & Admissions Information

### TUITION

Saint Thomas Academy's 2008-09 tuition is \$15,225 per student for all grades. Payments can be made on a monthly, quarterly or annual basis.

### FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Ensuring that a Saint Thomas Academy education is accessible and affordable to all interested young men, the school will provide more than \$1.7 million for need-based grants during the 2008-09 school year. The individual grant averages \$7,100.

Financial aid forms are available in January. Specific factors, including income, family size and assets are considered when determining need-based financial aid. ### ANNUAL FUND

The Academy's Annual Fund accounts for approximately 13% of the annual budget and directly supports the operations of the school. Currently, tuition and fees cover only 80% of the cost of an STA education; the Annual Fund makes up the difference. The 2008-09 Annual Fund goal is \$1.5 million.

### Required Entrance Exam Testing Dates:

Without the Annual Fund, tuition costs would increase to \$18,000 per student, limiting the number of families who could afford an Academy education. Unlike tuition payments, Annual Fund gifts are tax-deductible. Each year, all current and past parents, faculty and staff, Board of Trustees, friends and alumni are asked to contribute cash gifts to the Annual Fund to provide an excellent education for as many students as possible.

### ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIPS

In addition to need-based grants, incoming freshmen who have submitted a completed application and taken the entrance exam on January 17, may qualify for an academic scholarship. The following are available: Academic Scholarship, \$1,000 (ten available); Saint Thomas Aquinas Scholarship, \$750 (eight available); Leadership Scholarship, \$500 (eight available). A student's academic performance must be comparable to his exam rankings.

### TRANSPORTATION

Saint Thomas Academy and sister school Visitation provide bus transportation for some parts of the metro area. While transportation to school is primarily the responsibility of the family and student, the schools will subsidize some of the cost of operating a bus route for the school year. Some bus routes have morning, after-school and activity service, while others have only morning and activity service.
