

Saint Thomas Academy's Waldvogel Qualifies for State Geographic Bee

J. Waldvogel '15 was named a semifinalist eligible to compete in the 2010 Minnesota Geographic Bee. Bees were held in schools with fourth- through eight-grade students throughout the state to determine each school's Geographic Bee winner.

School-level winners then took a qualifying test, which they submitted to the National Geographic Society. The Society then invited the students with the top 100 scores to compete at the state level.

The 2010 Minnesota Geographic Bee will be held at St. Cloud State University on Friday, April 9, 2010.

The state winner will receive \$100, the "National Geographic Collegiate Atlas of the World," and a trip to Washington, D.C., where he/she will represent Minnesota in the national finals at the National Geographic Society headquarters, May 25-26, 2010. The first-place national winner will receive a \$25,000 college scholarship, a lifetime membership in the Society and an all-expense paid trip to the Galapagos Islands.
