Philosophy and Background

Saint Thomas Academy invites students to cultivate a vital and relevant spirituality through service, reflection, and prayer. The school's goal is to empower students by encouraging them to become servant-leaders who respect others and work for justice and peace. Since this dimension of a student's development is an integral part of its mission, the Academy has a Graduation Requirement of 40 service hours. These usually involve 10 miscellaneous hours completed here at school and 30 hours at an approved agency.

These 40 hours completed throughout junior or senior year, complement this **5-day Senior Project, which is completed during the last week of senior year, where students are mentored in their responsibilities within one of 40 religious, educational, health, or social service agencies.** Through this experience, students gain insight, compassion, communication, and helping skills, while working with inner-city children, senior citizens, the homeless, people dealing with serious health issues, physically and mentally challenged children and adults, and newly arrived neighbors. The Academy hopes that this program will give our graduating students the opportunity to discover the heart of Jesus and live in His spirit forever.

Seniors,

In making your selection, consider the commitment you are making. To choose wisely study and research:

- Agency description: Most agencies will provide an experience for seniors that is a mix of manual labor and resident/child/client contact.
- Transportation ... car pooling
- After school commitment ... check times ... you can't bi-locate.
- Seek information ... don't hesitate to ask questions and, of course, check websites.

Basic Principles of Operating:

- 1. Each student is to work 5 "six-hour" days. Lunchtime *may* count as time served it may not. It is up to the site supervisor.
- If a student is ill, he needs to call his agency supervisor and school at STA before 8:00 a.m. The Attendance Office will inform Mr. Hagar and Mr. Seidel. Agency supervisors will be contacting Mr. Seidel directly about any absences or early departures every day.
- 3. All absences need to be made up. The only exception to this "standard of reliability" is when a student is a member of a team that is participating in a conference or section match (not practice) or attending an older sibling's graduation. Students should communicate this well in advance. Other than these excused absences, students will complete any needed "make up" days on May 31, June 1, 2, and 3.

- 4. Every student is to follow all the rules and policies of the agency concerning attendance, punctuality, appropriate dress, grooming, behavior, and confidentiality. Students are also to meet the STA standard of good appearance while representing the school.
- 5. The 5 days STA students spend working at service agencies are to be considered school days. Any concerns about the agency, the supervision or the work being done, please direct them to Mr. Seidel.
- 6. Do not schedule trips or elective surgery during Senior Projects. Any time missed for these two types of conflicts will need to be made up before graduation.

NEW THIS YEAR ONLY: We need 6 Seniors to choose The Wall That Heals site here at STA for their service project.

Who qualifies to sign up for and participate in Senior May Projects?

- Students who have completed their service graduation requirement will participate in Senior Service Projects. This requirement includes:
 - 40 hours of service completed, signed off by site supervisor. Deadline for this requirement is March 8, 2022 or later with Mr. Seidel's permission. MOST students check-in 10 miscellaneous hours (mostly done at school) with Mr. Seidel doing any type of volunteering and then focus their energy on choosing a 30 hour one-site project to finish the requirement.

\Rightarrow Students with disciplinary or attendance/tardy concerns:

Students on Mr. Hagar's list of disciplinary concerns may not be eligible to participate in Senior Projects

- These students will have to complete their Senior requirement by May 18. They will then be placed at an agency by Mr. Seidel. They must complete their senior requirement of 40 hours if they are to "walk across the cathedral floor" Thursday evening, June 2, graduation night.
- Students, who do not qualify for Senior Projects will remain at STA and work on their academics in order to meet graduation requirements.
- Placement in agencies will be determined on by the "order of selection" list established throughout the year as students completed and registered hours.
